GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Show time: Saturday, August 11, 2018 at 10:00 a.m.

Test Dates: Saturday, July 28, 2018 at 1:00 p.m. & Friday, August 10, 2018 at 1:00 p.m.

Rules:

1. Open to registered 4-H youth who have turned in all their fees and all their paperwork by July 15, 2018.
2. Live animal Showmanship will consist of animals from the following Livestock and Small Animal Divisions: Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Swine, Sheep, Rabbits, Cavy and Poultry. All participants are required to show live animals from these divisions.
3. To qualify for Master Stockman competition, the participant must place 1st or 2nd in Showmanship class in the following divisions: Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Swine, Sheep, Rabbits, Cavy, and Poultry.
4. If a 4-H member places 1st or 2nd in Showmanship in two or more Divisions, then the member will choose only one Division under which to enter. The 3rd place exhibitor in that class will then be allowed to compete in that Division.
5. Round Robin Showmanship Contest will be scored (per specie) on:
 - A. Showmanship - 20
 - B. Knowledge - 10
 - C. Personal Appearance of Exhibitor - 5
6. Questions will encompass all aspects of breeding, showing, market, veterinary science, and animal husbandry. Questions for this contest are formulated from information obtained from *Michigan State University Extension Publications. Livestock Resource Manual* may be obtained from the 4-H Livestock Developmental Committee.
7. All participants must be in show attire. See dress code and superintendent requirements.
8. Master Stockman winner from previous year will be allowed to compete, but not place, for the current year providing they meet the requirements as stated in Rule 3 above.
9. Exhibitors that take a 1st place in their Showmanship class will be awarded the maximum points allowed for that specie in the Round Robin showing portion of test. Exhibitors who have placed 1st in Showmanship in multiple classes **MUST** designate what specie they wish to take the points.

SECTION - 2: Educational Market & Breed - Record Books

Rules:

1. In order to participate in the market livestock competition and auction, 4-H youth and non-4-H youth, are required to submit one completed record book regardless of the number of species being shown.
2. The purpose of the Educational Record Book is to keep record of purchases and expenditures associated with the market project. Proper management skills and record keeping for the market animal is the goal.
3. All market projects entered in the class must have met the possession date, the tattoo date, or the banding date.
4. Educational Market Books are available from 4-H Livestock Developmental Committee Web Site (<https://waynecounty4hlivestock.weebly.com>), Record book Chairperson, or the Fair office.
5. All Educational Record books must be completed and turned in to MSU Extension 4-H personnel or whomever is administering the Master Stockman Test on the same day as the official Master Stockman test, **July 28, 2018, between 12:00 p.m.-2:00 pm.**
6. Exhibitors or parents are not allowed to be present during the evaluation of the record books.
7. Based on class size, Educational Record Book classes may be combined and judged on percentages.
 - Junior: 9 - 10 years old as of Jan. 1, 2018
 - Intermediate: 11 - 13 years old as of Jan. 1, 2018
 - Senior: 14 years and up as of Jan. 1, 2018
8. Turning in an incomplete Educational Record Book will result in a 3% reduction from total auction earnings. Inappropriate or vulgar responses may also result in a 3% reduction.
9. Record books turned in late will receive an additional ½% reduction per day late. No record books will be accepted after July 31, 2018. You will not be allowed to participate in the Fair Board Livestock Auction, regardless of placement.
10. The majority of the Educational Record Book can and should be completed before Fair. Research questions and work on the book throughout the year.
11. An easy way to keep up with feed purchases, other expenses and daily events is to use a folder. Hang a calendar large enough to write on in a convenient place. Take the time to write down when you increase feed, work your animal, administer medication, etc. Then, when you sit down to organize your record book, all of the information you need, will be located together. Place all receipts and important information in the folder.
12. **Complete all sections**, double check your math calculations. Be sure to add dollar signs and unit labels (lbs., oz., etc.) as needed.
13. Have someone review your spelling and grammar. Always use proper spelling and write neatly.
14. The final Educational Record Book is to be written in **black or blue pen** by the exhibitor.
15. If rules are not followed, your Educational Record Book may lose points or be disqualified from grading and/or being displayed at auction.
16. Educational Record Books will be displayed during the livestock auction.
17. Previous years' Educational Record Books can be displayed in the Youth Building under Educational Projects.

Rules:

1. This program is open to registered 4-H youth ages 9 - 19 years of age as of January 1st, of the current year, who have turned in their fees and paperwork on time.
2. Registration for this program is Tuesday, May 6th at 6:00pm. If you are unable to attend the registration workshop, you must notify the 4-H Jr Livestock Board. A Protégé Book will be provided to each child at registration and must be completed and turned in on the Saturday prior to Fair.
3. Age groups are as follows:

Beef:	9 -19 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 9-12, Senior 13-19)
Dairy:	9 -19 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 9-12, Senior 13-19)
Goat:	9 -19 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 9-12, Senior 13-19)
Sheep:	9 - 19 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 9-12, Senior 13-19)
Swine:	9 - 19 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 9-12, Senior 13-19)
Rabbit:	9 - 19 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 9-12, Senior 13-19)
Poultry:	9 - 19 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 9-12, Senior 13-19)
Cavy:	9 - 19 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 9-12, Senior 13-19)
4. Protégé exhibitors are not allowed to show in the regular division in which they are Protégés.

SECTION - 4: Livestock Cloverbuds

Exhibit Fee: \$10.00 per child (may do more than one species)

Rules:

1. This program is open to registered 4-H youth ages 5-8 years of age as of January 1st of the current year, who have turned in their paper work and fees on time.
2. Registration for this program is Tuesday, May 1st at 6:00 p.m. If you are unable to attend the registration workshop, you must notify the Junior 4-H Livestock Board. More information regarding registration may be obtained from Donna Budd. A Cloverbud Book will be provided to each child at registration and must be completed and turned in on the Saturday prior to Fair.
3. Age groups are as follows:

Beef:	5-8 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 5-6, Senior 7-8)
Dairy:	5-8 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 5-6, Senior 7-8)
Goat:	5-8 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 5-6, Senior 7-8)
Sheep:	5-8 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 5-6, Senior 7-8)
Swine:	5-8 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 5-6, Senior 7-8)
Rabbit:	5-8 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 5-6, Senior 7-8)
Poultry:	5-8 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 5-6, Senior 7-8)
Cavy:	5-8 years of age as of January 1 (Junior 5-6, Senior 7-8)
4. Cloverbuds may own their own animals or use their teacher's. Cloverbuds are not allowed to show in regular divisions.
5. Each teacher and Cloverbud will receive an award for participation in the program.

6. Five and Six (5-6) year old's may be involved with animals on a halter or lead. They must be directly assisted one-on-one by a youth teacher, and a parent, guardian, or adult volunteer who is on the ground holding the animal's halter or lead to maximize safety.
