Rules:

1. Entry Deadline is **June 1. ALL CLASSENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED BY JUNE 1 AND PAYMENT ENCLOSED OR A \$1.00 PER CLASS LATE FEE WILL BE CHARGED.**
2. Entry fees: \$1.00 per item per class.
3. Entries accepted Saturday, August 6, 2011 from Noon to 5 p.m.
4. Exhibitor to furnish container unless otherwise stated.
5. Exhibitor must remove all floriculture found to be spoiling from display. This must be done at 9 a.m. before Fair opens.
6. Wilted flowers must be replaced.
7. Entries will be released Sunday, August 14, 2011 from Noon to 4 p.m.
8. Exhibitors must grow all entries in this division unless otherwise noted.
9. General Rules, Section 2, #1, governs the acceptance of exhibits
10. Exhibitor must be 19 years or older to exhibit in the Community Arts Building.
11. *NO PREVIOUSLY ENTERED ITEMS ALLOWED.*
12. No changes after exhibit has been accepted.
13. Age **must** be on entry form to be eligible for oldest exhibitor.

SECTION - 1: Flower Arrangements

Rules: The arrangement may not exceed overall diameter of 18" or overall height of 18".

Judging:

1. Proportion & Stability (arrangement to base) 30
2. Color, harmony, rhythm 40
3. Balance and symmetry 30

Note: The judge will make special note of the trueness of color in species in the arrangement when judging class 246 and 250.

250. Corsage or Wedding Bouquet (Silk Flowers - New)

251. Any Other

SECTION - 2: Flowers, Ornamentals, and Container Gardens

Rules:

1. Exhibits will be displayed in a narrow neck vase that is provided by the Fair.
2. The foliage must be left on the specimens exhibited - above the water line of vase.
3. Wilted flowers must be replaced as needed.
4. All plants and flowers must be grown by exhibitor.
5. Over 3 1/2" blossom - one specimen. Under 3 1/2" blossom - three specimens, with foliage.

268. Container Garden - For Apartment Gardener Tomato Plant or Green Beans in a Pot
269. Any Other
