Show Time: Tuesday - 6:00 p.m.

Stall Fee: \$3.00 per head

Rules:

1. Exhibitors must wear suitable shirt, denim pants, and hard soled shoes when showing their animal which they have personally fitted and trained.
2. See General Rules Dairy, Livestock and Horse Division, Rule #20 for Bovine Tuberculosis testing and movement requirements.
3. An exhibitor may not show more than one animal per class, except where progeny necessitates duplication. Premium paid on only one animal if duplicate entries in a class.
4. All exhibit animals must be dehorned.
5. A flock shall consist of one doe, two years or over, in milk; one yearling, and one doe kid (current year). They may be of different breeds.
6. Exhibitor must maintain pens and animals throughout the Fair or exhibit will be sent home. Bedding must be removed and pens must be taken down at end of Fair or premiums will be forfeited.
7. All bucklings shown must be registered.
8. All market animals must be castrated.
9. Animals must be milked daily between 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. Animals will be checked to make sure they are milked dry.
10. All registered animals must be tattooed prior to the opening day of the Fair.
11. Exhibitor must be 8 years old as of January 1st of the current year.
12. Exhibitors showing Dairy breeds must wear suitable white attire, exhibitors showing Non Dairy breeds can wear jeans and a white shirt with sleeves, and all exhibitors must wear hard soled shoes.
13. Entry deadline is **JUNE 1. ALL CLASS ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED BY JUNE 1 AND PAYMENT ENCLOSED OR A \$1.00 PER HEAD LATE FEE WILL BE CHARGED.**
14. Due in stalls on Sunday, August 7, 2011, from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
15. Market animals must be in possession and tattooed according to livestock rules by May 1st of current year.
16. All exhibitors must exhibit an animal in one of the following classes, as well as showmanship.
17. All livestock shows will be a **“NATURAL SHOW”** which is defined as not using any products on the animal for fitting and showing. Clipping, sheering, and trimming of livestock animals will still be allowed. Failure to follow these guidelines may result in disqualification and loss of premiums.
18. Animals will not be released from stalls until August 14, 2011 at 8:00 a.m. Market animals may leave with processor after 11 p.m. on Saturday of Fair week. Auction animals may be taken to a livestock sale barn after 11 p.m. on Saturday of Fair week. Early removal will result in the loss of all premiums.
19. All stalls must be cleaned by the youth and inspected by the barn superintendent upon final departure. Failure to clean stalls and have them inspected will result in the loss of all premiums.
20. All barn decorations may be removed after 11:00 p.m. on August 13, 2011. Early removal will result in the loss of all premiums.
21. Grand & Reserve Champion market animals must be sold at auction.

SECTION - 9: Goat Milking

Rules:

1. Contestants must commence to milk their goat when the official gives the signal and will continue to milk for a period of 2 minutes for the Junior Division (8-13). Senior Division (14 & Over) will milk for a period of 1 minute.
2. All contestants will be in a sitting position when time starts.
3. One contestant per goat (NO HELPERS) while milking.
4. Milk will be weighed after it has been dumped into a special weighing pan. Pan must be rinsed out after each use. Each exhibitor must use his/ her own pail.
5. Any infraction of the above rules will automatically disqualify the contestant.
6. Contestants will wear suitable attire.

SECTION - 12: Record Books

Rules:

1. All Youth participating in the goat market class are required to enter the Livestock Record Book Classes.
2. The purpose of the Record Book is to keep record of purchases and expenditures associated with the market project. Proper management skills and record keeping for the market animal project is the goal.
3. Market goat projects entered in this class must have met the possession date weigh-in and tattooing.
4. Market Record Books are available from Laurie Rivetto (4-H Educator).
5. All record books must be completed and turned in to Laurie Rivetto on Tuesday, August 9, 2011 from 12 (noon) – 2pm.
6. Exhibitors and parents are not allowed to be present during the evaluation of the record books.
7. Based on class size record book classes may be combined and judged on percentages.
 - Junior 9-10 years old as of Jan. 1, 2011
 - Intermediate 11-13 years old as of Jan. 1, 2011
 - Senior 14 years and up as of Jan. 1, 2011
8. Failure to complete required record books will result in a 3% deduction from auction earnings.
