Rabbit Rules:

1. Entry deadline is **JULY 1**.
2. **ALL CLASS ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED BY JULY 1 AND PAYMENT ENCLOSED OR A \$1.00 PER HEAD LATE FEE WILL BE CHARGED.** Do in duplicate and send one copy to Tom Koppin, C/O W. C. F. A., P. O. Box 308, Belleville, Michigan 48112.
3. All exhibits will be checked in by superintendent or assistant before entry into cages - Sunday, August 12, 2007 from 12:00 noon to 5:00 p.m. All animals showing symptoms of disease or other abnormalities will be sent home.
4. All rabbits and cavies must be identified by a permanent legible ear mark. If you need someone to permanently I.D. your animal, contact the Barn Superintendent.
5. All pens must be cleaned before 9:00 a.m. each day. Rabbits and cavies must be fed and watered daily by exhibitor. Failure to do so may cost you demerits and loss of premiums.
6. Rabbit and cavy feed as well as food and water crocks are to be furnished by exhibitor for each pen. Animals without them will be given a warning and if not taken care of within an hour will be dismissed, without premiums.
7. Each exhibitor is allowed to bring a maximum of 15 breeding rabbits, 2 meat pens and a maximum of 10 cavies. Rabbits and cavies must be a minimum of 12 weeks old. These animals are to be owned by the exhibitor.
8. Rabbits and cavies will be judged according to breeds. All varieties will be grouped together by class.
9. Exhibitor must be eight (8) years of age as of December 31st of the current year. An exhibitor cannot show in both the protégé and youth division unless the exhibitor is the teacher.
10. Show will be run as a Coop Show with runners available to take rabbits and cavies to the show table.
11. Exhibitor must sign up for barn duty on the first day of Fair and will be responsible for that time period. Failure to do so may cost you demerits and loss of premium.
12. In addition to the confirmation class, an exhibitor is expected to show in the showmanship class.
13. Registration due **JULY 1**.
14. Animals will not be released from their stalls until August 19, 2007 at 8:00 a.m. Early removal will result in the loss of all premiums.
15. All barn decoration must remain up until after 11:00 p.m. on August 18, 2007. Early removal will result in the loss of all premiums.

MEAT PENS

1. Meat Pen Class will consist of three (3) rabbits all the same breed and variety.
2. Rabbits should not be more than sixty-nine (69) days old and a maximum of five (5) pounds each.
3. Meat Pens will be judged according to the ARBA standards on meat type.
4. The meat pen is to be raised by the exhibitor, and a Summary of Production will be required for all meat pens. These summaries will be due at the time of entry.
5. Meat Pens are expected to be sold at the Livestock Auction. Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Pen will be auctioned first, then all other A awards, then B awards.

AWARDS

1. The Board of Directors shall have the power to make prorated deductions from premiums offered if, in their opinion, the financial conditions of the Association render it necessary.
2. Trophies will be given to the Best of Breed for the top ten (10) breeds showing with at least ten (10) animals in the section.
3. Premiums will be paid each exhibitor, according to the judges placing as indicated by the division and class entered. No exhibitor shall be paid more than one premium per class.
4. No premium shall be awarded when an animal is deemed not worthy by the judge, or animals not properly cared for.
5. No premiums shall be paid on exhibits removed from the fairgrounds in violation of the rules of the association.
6. Breeding or Production Classes: Classes numbered one through six in each section will consist of one buck or one doe. Rabbits will be judged on breeding or production quality only as set up by ARBA standards. The classes are determined by age and sex.
